Imagine this: *Yesterday was your mother's funeral. Your father also died a few months ago. You are now responsible for the care and protection of an older sister, two younger sisters, and a younger brother. You will turn eighteen in a few months. You don't have a high school education, so your chances of finding a good job are poor.*

That is exactly what happened to Rampu Leferefere two years ago. We first met him in October when he was saved at a tent meeting in his village. Since then God has given him the opportunity to go back to high school, and his older sister found a job at a factory. She only makes \$100 a month, so the family is still very poor.

Through the generosity of people who give to help orphans in Lesotho, we are supporting the middle sister, Selena. Each month we buy staple foods and give them to the family. We will also occasionally help her with money to buy clothes or supplies for school. Since we started supporting them, they have all been coming to church. Please help us pray that the whole family will be saved.
