Back in 1993 FEA Ministries was given a mission work and some properties in the country of Lesotho, Africa. The intention of the donor was that FEA Ministries would continue planting holiness churches, training pastors, and operating a clinic with the help of some godly national pastors. When we first received this mission work, FEA didn't have any missionaries in the Southern Africa field. As a result, the legal details of the transfer were never properly attended to. By the time American missionaries did arrive, these formalities had been forgotten in the concerted effort to build God's Kingdom in Lesotho.

More than twenty years later, this mistake has become painfully evident. A handful of people have claimed that the properties belong to them. Over the last couple years, they have lost most of their unity and credibility, but the problem is not completely solved. In an effort to bring this situation to final resolution, Hope International Missions is taking steps to legalize the transfer of these properties into our name. This step will incur significant legal expenses. We are coming to you, our faithful partners, to ask for your

generous financial assistance to secure the future of Hope International Missions' ministry in Lesotho.
